Industry Overview : <i>(Brief description of the sector)</i>	<p>Singapore has a growing and vibrant electronics industry that accounted for S\$90 billion, or over a quarter of Singapore's manufacturing GDP in 2017. The sector is made up of over 2,900 companies with key activities in semiconductor, consumer electronics and information technology. Other niche areas include encryption technology, integrated circuit design, satellite communications, and wireless technology.</p> <p>Singapore offers the breadth of the electronics value chain, that range from research and development, design, manufacturing, and distribution services. As a global trading and distribution hub for electronics and semiconductors, Singapore exported more than US\$80 billion (S\$108 billion) worth of semiconductors and electronic integrated circuits to the world in 2016. This comprises almost 10% of global electronics and semiconductors exports. Some of the world's biggest pure-play foundries have manufacturing facilities here, as do many other top outsourced semiconductor assembly and test companies. Beyond semiconductors, Singapore is also a key node in the global supply chain for products ranging from storage and memory products, to microelectromechanical systems (MEMS). These manufacturers are supported by a rich ecosystem of leading materials & equipment and electronics manufacturing services players.</p>

Programme Name :	Rank-and-File Place-and-Train Programme for Electronics Operator
Programme Overview :	<p>As part of Workforce Singapore's (WSG) initiative to support mid-career rank-and-file (RnFs) jobseekers and help them move into new occupations and sectors, WSG worked with the Singapore Economic Development Board (EDB), the Singapore Semiconductor Industry Association (SSIA), and the electronics industry to develop the Place-and-Train (PnT) Programme for Electronics Operator. The PnT integrates job-matching and training to help RnF jobseekers join the industry, and to reskill those with the necessary competencies to take on new job roles as Operators or equivalent.</p> <p>This is a 3-month programme which operates on a Place-and-Train mode. RnFs are hired by participating companies before undergoing training through customised facilitated classroom training and structured On-the-Job Training (OJT). The programme is designed for different job roles and can be further tailored to individuals' development needs so as to equip them with the relevant skills and competencies for successful career conversions.</p>
